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THE INFORMATION BELOW IS CONFIDENTIAL - FOR USE BY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ONLY

On 08/30/2025, I, Officer Porcaro was patrolling the Levee District when I observed a male sleeping on a park bench in between Shoe Depot and Ross. As sleeping on streets and sidewalks is prohibited by ordinance in the city of East Peoria, I approached the male. The male was still sleeping as I approached him. I identified the male as a Tyler Paulsgrove. I have had multiple criminal encounters with Tyler and was familiar with him. I was also aware Tyler was wanted on an active Tazewell County warrant.

Prior to waking Tyler up, I confirmed with dispatch Tyler was wanted on an active warrant. Due to Tyler's past aggressive conduct with Police, I waited for other officers to arrive prior to waking Tyler up.

Once other units arrived, I placed Tyler in handcuffs double locking and checking for proper fit. I searched Tyler and did not locate any contraband. Tyler was placed in the back of my patrol car. The warrant was confirmed by dispatch.

Once in the back of my patrol car, Tyler began kicking my partition and rear driver's side window and spitting. As I feared Tyler was going to break the glass on my patrol car, I, along with assisting officers, removed him from the patrol car and placed him in a RIPP restraint and spit hood. Once the RIPP restraint was applied, Tyler refused to stand up. Assisting officers had to pick Tyler up and place him in the car. Tyler propped his feet on the seat and made further attempts to not get into the car. I had to force Tyler's feet into the rear seat footwell so he could be placed in the car. The RIPP Restraint was secured to the rear prisoner seat and Tyler was secured.

Tyler was transported to Tazewell County Jail where he was lodged on the outstanding Tazewell County warrant (25CM478 FTA Trespass) and a complaint for Resisting Arrest. Tyler was also issued a City Admin Notice for EP Sleeping on Streets and Sidewalks.

My BWC was activated during this encounter.

On 08/30/2025 around 0411 hours, I overheard Officer Porcaro get dispatched to Ross Dress For Less, in regards to a male sleeping on a park bench.

Once Officer Porcaro was on scene, he ran Tyler Paulsgrove over the radio. Dispatch advised that he had an active Tazewell County warrant. (See Officer Pocaro's original report)

A while later I heard Officer Porcaro ask for additional units due to the Tyler trying to kick the windows out of the squad car. I responded to assist other officers who were on scene. As I exited my squad car, I observed Tyler sitting upright on the ground handcuffed, his ankles tethered in a rip restraint hobble, and a spit mask over his head. Officer Porcaro secured the harness RIP restraint in the back seat of his squad car. Officers attempted to lift Tyler to his feet, but Tyler would not stand up. I grabbed the front of Tyler's pants and assisted him into the back seat of the squad car. Once I had him in the car, Tyler put his legs straight out and tried to kick himself backwards toward me. I struck Tyler on top of the legs with my hand to try to get him to put his feet in the foot well. Tyler did not comply. I pulled my taser, activated it and placed it on his thigh. I told him that he was going to be tased if he did not place his feet in the foot well. At this point Tyler complied. He sat forwarded making it difficult to place him if the harness restraint. I placed my taser in the middle of his chest and told him to sit back or he would be tased. Tyler sat back. I holsters my taser and was able to secure him in the restraint. This ended my involvement in this incident.

I had my BWC on and activated during this incident.

Homeless Persons

424.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that personnel understand the needs and rights of the homeless and to establish procedures to guide officers during all contacts with the homeless, whether consensual or for enforcement purposes. The East Peoria Police Department recognizes that members of the homeless community are often in need of special protection and services. It is the goal of the East Peoria Police Department to address these needs in balance with the overall mission of this department. Therefore, officers will consider the following when serving the homeless community.

424.1.1 POLICY

It is the policy of the East Peoria Police Department to provide law enforcement services and to protect the rights, dignity and private property of all members of the community, regardless of their socioeconomic status. Homelessness is not a crime and members of this department will not use homelessness solely as a basis for detention or law enforcement action.

424.2 FIELD CONTACTS

Officers are encouraged to contact the homeless for purposes of rendering aid, support and for community-oriented policing purposes. When encountering a homeless person who has committed a non-violent misdemeanor and continued freedom is not likely to result in a continuation of the offense or a breach of the peace officers may consider long-term solutions to problems that may relate to the homeless, such as shelter referrals and counseling in lieu of physical arrest. However, nothing in this policy is meant to dissuade an officer from taking reasonable enforcement action when facts support a reasonable suspicion of criminal activity.

Officers should provide homeless persons with resource and assistance information whenever it is reasonably apparent such services may be appropriate.

424.2.1 OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Homeless members of the community will receive the same level and quality of service provided to other members of the community. The fact that a victim or witness is homeless can, however, require special considerations for a successful investigation and prosecution. Officers should consider the following when handling investigations involving homeless victims, witnesses or suspects:

- (a) Document alternate contact information. This may include obtaining addresses and phone numbers of relatives and friends.
- (b) Document places the homeless person may frequent.
- (c) Provide homeless victims with victim/witness resources when appropriate.
- (d) Obtain statements from all available witnesses in the event a homeless victim is unavailable for a court appearance.

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- (e) Consider whether the person may be a dependent adult or elder and if so proceed in accordance with the Adult Abuse Policy.
- (f) Arrange for transportation for investigation related matters, such as medical exams and court appearances.
- (g) Consider whether a crime should be reported and submitted for prosecution even when a homeless victim indicates he/she does not desire prosecution.

424.3 PERSONAL PROPERTY

The personal property of homeless persons must not be treated differently than the property of other members of the public. Officers should use reasonable care when handling, collecting and retaining the personal property of homeless persons and should not destroy or discard the personal property of homeless persons.

When a homeless person is arrested, or otherwise removed from a public place, officers should make reasonable accommodations to permit the person to lawfully secure his/her personal property. Otherwise, the personal property should be collected for safekeeping. If the arrestee has more personal property than can reasonably be collected and transported by the officer, a supervisor should be consulted. The property should be photographed and measures should be taken to remove or secure the property. It will be the supervisor's responsibility to coordinate the removal and safekeeping of the property.

Officers should not conduct or assist in clean-up operations of belongings that reasonably appear to be the property of homeless persons without the prior authorization of a supervisor. When practicable, requests by the public for clean-up operations of a homeless encampment should be referred to the officer's immediate supervisor. .

Officers who encounter unattended encampments, bedding or other personal property in public areas that reasonably appears to belong to a homeless person should not remove or destroy such property unless such property appears to involve a trespass, blight to the community or is the subject of a complaint from the owner of the property upon which the encampment is found. Such property should be secured until reasonable attempts to return it to its owner have been made and shall be disposed of pursuant to the property disposal requirements of policy 801.

424.4 MENTAL ILLNESS AND MENTAL IMPAIRMENT

Some homeless persons may suffer from a mental illness or a mental impairment. Officers shall not detain a homeless person under a mental illness commitment unless facts and circumstances warrant such a detention (See the Civil Commitments Policy).

When a mental illness hold is not warranted, the contacting officer should provide the homeless person with contact information for mental health assistance as appropriate. In these circumstances, officers may provide transportation to a mental health specialist if requested by the person and approved by a supervisor.

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424.5 ECOLOGICAL ISSUES

Sometimes homeless encampments can impact the ecology and natural resources of the community and may involve criminal offenses beyond mere littering. Officers are encouraged to notify other appropriate agencies or departments when a significant impact to our environment has or is likely to occur. Significant impacts to the environment may warrant a crime report, investigation, supporting photographs and supervisor notification.
