More than 50,000 people experience homelessness in Chicago each year—whether that's sleeping outside, on couches, or in shelters.

Now is the time to expand affordable housing, not reduce it and send thousands of families into instability. We need stable, local funding to make sure we are looking out for our fellow Chicagoans. **First, we have to protect what we have, so the problem doesn't get even worse.**

What's at risk if we don't fund housing in this year's budget?

- People lose their housing and experience instability and homelessness
- Longer waitlists for other affordable housing
- Strain on existing homeless resources and shelters

Why is this happening now?

- Local housing programs aren't getting the funding they need and can't keep up with rising costs
- Previously stable support from the federal government is now disappearing

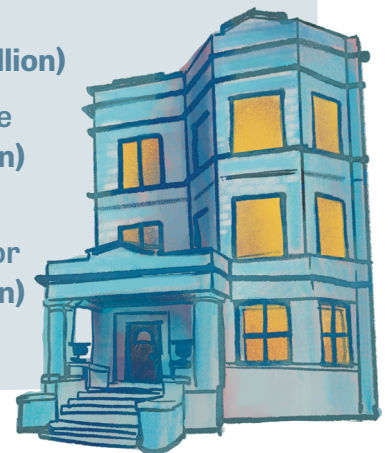
We are asking our city leaders to include these essential priorities in next year's city budget to prevent people from losing their homes:

- ✓ **Protect housing and services at risk due to Trump cuts. (\$15 million)**
- ✓ **The Chicago Low Income Housing Trust Fund ensures there are rents that the lowest-income Chicagoans can afford. (\$13 million)**
- ✓ **The Flexible Housing Pool supports Chicagoans with serious physical and mental health needs or people returning from jail or prison with a stable place to live and needed services. (\$2 million)**
